MARY MAGDALENE

Apostle to the Apostles

IN THE ECCLESIA-WINGARD CLASSROOM

Who was Mary Magdalene? Why is she so often left out of discussions of Jesus's main disciples? What does knowing more about her do to our understanding of the Gospel and our understanding of our own relationship to the Christ? This small group will consider some of these questions from Cynthia Bourgeault's course "Mary Magdalene: Apostle to Our Own Times" and her book, *The Meaning of Mary Magdalene: Discovering the Woman at the Heart of Christianity*. Having better answers to these questions, Bourgeault argues, invites us to rebuild our trust in the ministry of love that is core to becoming more "fully human." Familiarity with the course and the book are not required for our discussions.
